SRM Program welcomes Dr. Robert Zullo

Faculty in the SRM program are pleased to welcome Dr. Robert Zullo. Dr. Zullo comes to JMU from Mississippi State University in Starkville, Mississippi.

Dr. Zullo received his undergraduate degree from the University of Virginia in 1997; masters from the University of North Carolina -Chapel Hill in 2001; and Ph.D. from the University of Georgia in 2005. Professionally, Dr. Zullo has enjoyed a wealth of different experiences. He worked in the athletic departments at Virginia Military Institute and the University of North Carolina before moving on to Virginia Tech to become the Assistant Director of Sport Marketing in 2000. Dr. Zullo also worked in Development at the University of Georgia before becoming a professor in 2005. He also spent time



over the years working with the New York Mets, Washington Bullets, George Michael Sports Machine, DC United, and was on staff for the 1999 U.S. Open.

Dr. Zullo's primary research inter-

ests involve external issues in Division I Intercollegiate Athletics, including fundraising, sponsorships, revenue generation, crisis management, and third party partnerships. "My teaching philosophy revolves around strong application in the classroom," he explains. "With over 300 programs in sports management, I want my students' experiences to separate them from their peers in other majors and at other schools."

Dr. Zullo is happy to return to Virginia. After three years of dodging hurricanes and tornados, he says that he cannot wait to see some snow. He also claims to be the only SRM faculty member currently on Facebook. In addition to his research, Dr. Zullo also enjoys competing in sports. He is currently playing intramural flag football with the graduate students and is trying his best to not get hurt.

An Alumnus with an Exciting Career in Sport

James Madison University alumnus Bill Papierniak (BBA '95) has had a very successful career since leaving Harrisonburg. Papierniak has spent the past 11 years as an administrator in Minor League Baseball. He began his career with the Carolina League's Lynchburg Hillcats and has also worked for the Hagerstown Suns. For the past 6 years, he has been the General Manager for the Daytona Cubs.

The Daytona Cubs organization has seen continued success since Papierniak arrived. The club set attendance records for each of the last five years, and in 2008, they saw the attendance numbers climb to 164,000. In 2006, the Daytona Cubs received the Bob Freitas Award as the best organization in Minor League Baseball (Class A) – which is awarded by Baseball America for the team with the longest continuing contribution to the baseball industry. That same year, Papierniak was chosen as Executive of the Year by the Florida State League. While the personal accolades are gratifying,

Papierniak suggests that "it is the growth of the Daytona Cubs that has been the most rewarding."

Looking back, Papierniak is thankful for the experience that he received at JMU. "JMU challenged me intellectually and helped me realize that you have to work hard to reach the goals that you set for yourself," says Papierniak. Papierniak lives in Daytona with his wife, JMU alum Michelle (formerly Huston), and their two children, Trae and Ainsley. "Most of all," says Papierniak, "I've been able to have a career doing something that I love."


